Prelude and Announcements

<u>Confession and Forgiveness</u> P: Blessed be the Holy Trinity, one God, the God of manna, the God of miracles, the God of mercy. **C: Amen.**

P: Drawn to Christ and seeking God's abundance, let us confess our sins. *A moment of silence for reflection.*

P: God our provider, C: help us. It is hard to believe there is enough to share. We question your ways when they differ from the ways of the world in which we live. We turn to our own understanding rather than trusting in you. We take offense at your teachings and your ways. Turn us again to you. Where else can we turn? Share with us the words of eternal life and feed us for life in the world. Amen. P: Beloved people of God, in Jesus, the manna from heaven, you are fed and nourished.

By Jesus, the worker of miracles,

there is always more than enough.

Through Jesus, the bread of life,

you are shown God's mercy:

you are forgiven and loved into abundant life.

C: Amen

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **C: And also with you.**

Gathering Dialog (Deuteronomy 26, 11, 8)

A: You are the treasured people of the Lord,

C: a people holy to the Lord our God.

A: Keep the words of the Lord in your heart; teach them to your children.

C: Talk about them when you are at home and when you are away,

when you lie down and when you rise.

A: One does not live by bread alone,

C: but by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

Prayer of the Day

A: Let us pray...

God of heaven and earth, before the foundation of the universe and the beginning of time you are the triune God: Author of creation, eternal Word of salvation, life-giving Spirit of wisdom. Guide us to all truth by your Spirit, that we may proclaim all that Christ has revealed and rejoice in the glory he shares with us; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **C: Amen.**

First Reading Proverbs 8:1-21 B: Does not wisdom call. and does not understanding raise her voice? ²On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: ⁴"To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. ⁵O simple ones, learn prudence; acquire intelligence, you who lack it. ⁶Hear, for I will speak noble things, and from my lips will come what is right; ⁷for my mouth will utter truth; wickedness is an abomination to my lips. ⁸All the words of my mouth are righteous; there is nothing twisted or crooked in them. ⁹They are all straight to one who understands and right to those who find knowledge. ¹⁰Take my instruction instead of silver, and knowledge rather than choice gold; ¹¹for wisdom is better than jewels, and all that you may desire cannot compare with her. ¹²I, wisdom, live with prudence, and I attain knowledge and discretion. ¹³The fear of the LORD is hatred of evil. Pride and arrogance and the way of evil and perverted speech I hate. ¹⁴I have good advice and sound wisdom; I have insight, I have strength.

¹⁵By me kings reign, and rulers decree what is just; ¹⁶by me rulers rule, and nobles, all who govern rightly. ¹⁷I love those who love me. and those who seek me diligently find me. ¹⁸Riches and honor are with me, enduring wealth and prosperity. ¹⁹My fruit is better than gold, even fine gold, and my yield than choice silver. ²⁰I walk in the way of righteousness, along the paths of justice, ²¹endowing with wealth those who love me, and filling their treasuries. After the reading the reader may say: The Word of the Lord C: Thanks be to God.

Scripture Poetry Proverbs 8:22-36 (read responsively) D: The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. C: Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. D: When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. C: Before the mountains had been shaped. before the hills. I was brought forth— D: when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. C: When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, D: when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, C: when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth. D: then I was beside him, like a master worker: and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, C: rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race. D: And now, my children, listen to me: happy are those who keep my ways.

Hear instruction and be wise,
and do not neglect it.
C: Happy is the one who listens to me,
watching daily at my gates,
waiting beside my doors.
D: For whoever finds me finds life
and obtains favor from the LORD;
C: but those who miss me injure themselves;
all who hate me love death."

<u>Second Reading</u> Proverbs 9:1-6 E: Wisdom has built her house, she has hewn her seven pillars. ²She has slaughtered her animals, she has mixed her wine, she has also set her table. ³She has sent out her servant-girls, she calls from the highest places in the town, ⁴"You that are simple, turn in here!" To those without sense she says, ⁵"Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed. ⁶Lay aside immaturity, and live, and walk in the way of insight." *After the reading the reader may say:* The Word of the Lord **C: Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Acclamation (Proverbs 9:10)

C: Alleluia. The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight. Alleluia.

Gospel Reading Matthew 11:25-30

The gospel is announced:

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 5th chapter.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

²⁵At that time Jesus said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; ²⁶yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ²⁷All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. ²⁸"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy

burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." *After the reading:* P: The Gospel of the Lord **C: Praise to you O Christ.**

1. Let all things now living

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
